### Preliminary Agenda:

The 2007 Tomato Breeders Roundtable (TBRT) will be held at the **Nittany Lion Inn** (<http://www.pshs.psu.edu/nittanylioninn/nlhome.asp>), located on the University Park campus at Penn State University in State College, PA. The meeting will open with a welcome reception on Sunday evening, Nov. 4<sup>th</sup>. The meeting presentations will start on Monday morning, Nov. 5<sup>th</sup> and conclude on Wednesday, Nov. 7<sup>th</sup> at noon. The meeting agenda will include an all day **tour** on Tuesday, Nov. 6<sup>th</sup> (see below). There will also be a dinner banquet on Monday evening. Check the TBRT website for updates.

### Special Tour:

There will be visits to several Penn State facilities, including the Mushroom Research Center, Air Pollution Control Center, Russell E. Larson Research Center and High Tunnels at Rock Springs, and the Huck Institute for Life Sciences. There also will be a tour of [AccuWeather.com](http://www.accuweather.com) and possibly the historic **Penn's Cave**, America's only all water cavern and wildlife park.

### Registration:

The conference early registration fee is \$200 (\$100 for students). **The deadline for early registration is September 1, 2007.** Registration after September 1 will increase by \$100. The fee includes the welcome reception, lunch and dinner banquet on Monday and lunch on Tuesday. **We encourage online registration via the 2007 TBRT secure website** using a credit card (VISA or MASTERCARD). ### Accommodations:

The meetings will be held at the Nittany Lion Inn, a Colonial-styled hotel run by the PSU Hospitality Services Program. This beautiful historic hotel is located on the University Park campus and is close to downtown State College. Rooms are available at a group rate of \$98 (single bed) or \$108 (double bed) per night until October 4, 2007. The hotel provides free parking for guests. ### Air Travel:

**University Park Airport (SCE)** offers daily flights to and from Philadelphia, Washington (Dulles), Detroit and Cincinnati. The University Park airport (<http://www.statecollegeairport.org/>) is a 10-15 minute drive from the Nittany Lion Inn.

### Ground Transportation from the Airport:

The Nittany Lion Inn has free shuttle service to and from the airport, however, prior arrangements must be made with the hotel for pick ups by phone or online. **Limousine and taxi** (<http://www.statecollegeairport.org/groundtransport/taxis.htm>) services are also available for all flights. A few major car rental companies are also available at the University Park Airport. For driving directions to the hotel visit the Nittany Lion Inn website.

**Registration Fee:**

Early Registration: \$200 (by September 1, 2007)  
\$100 for students (a letter from Department Head is required).

Late registration: \$300 (after Sept. 1, 2007)  
\$200 for students.

**Cancellation Policy:**

All cancellations must be received in writing to Dr. Majid Foolad by October 1, 2007. A \$50.00 processing fee will be applied. For cancellations after October 1, 2007, no refunds will be made.
